- 1. The Vice President, Arni Stinnissen chaired the meeting in the absence of the President. The meeting began with welcoming visitors, of which there were 6.
- 2. Sightings: The Brereton club had a Raptor tour of Minesing Wetlands, and found 2 juvenile bald eagles, 11 snowy owls, snow buntings; Sue reported 20-25 Bohemian Waxwings that visited her feeder area for 4 days, and 2 porcupines up in some trees. She found a dead grouse, and brought it in for our close inspection. Other reports included rough legged hawks at Strachan Tract, pileated woodpecker, northern shrike, raccoon, and at East Coulson Conservation property, tracks of coyote, fisher, grouse, deer, and fox.
- 3. A motion to approve the Minutes of the meeting of Jan. 3, 2018 was proposed by Betty Stanger, seconded by David Stanger, and approved by all.
- 4. Website all are encouraged to peruse the new website which is up and working smoothly.
- 5. Correspondence Kevin Binsted reported that he has received a letter of thanks from the Kevin Gangloff of the Orillia Youth Centre for our support of that organization's day at the Wye Marsh, when 23 youth and staff enjoyed a full day.

She mentioned that the ON AGM will be in the first week of June in Prince Edward County, while the regional meeting, hosted by Midland/Penetang Naturalists is April 21.
